

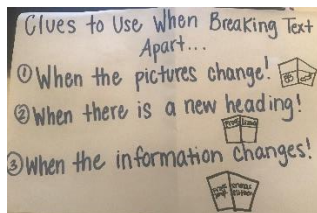
Teleschool Week 6: Second Grade

<u>Reading and Writing</u>				
<p><u>Weekly Read Aloud:</u> Use this read aloud to help guide you in your own nonfiction reading at home. You can view this as many times as you'd like, but at least once before the end of the week. Click here: Penguins</p> <p>Extra Nonfiction Read Aloud: Butterflies</p>				
<p>Today I want to teach you that readers can break longer text apart into sections. As they read they can use clues to figure out how to break the text apart.</p> <p>Watch the lesson: Reading Lesson</p> <p>Take one of your NF books and break it apart- use the chart to help.</p>	<p>Today I want to teach you that with each section of the text, readers stop and think, "What is this mostly about?"</p> <p>Watch the lesson: Reading Lesson</p> <p>Use the book you broke apart yesterday, read the sections and jot what each section was mostly about</p>	<p>Remember what you did last week. You thought of a topic, thought of chapters, and used real nonfiction books to look at how to make your book even better.</p> <p>Watch the lesson: Writing Lesson</p> <p>Time for kids read aloud and learning from the author: Helping Puffins</p>	<p>Today you are going to edit your writing! Slowly look back through each page. Read it out loud to see if you hear any mistakes.</p> <p>Watch the lesson: Writing Lesson</p> <p>Use the chart below to help you!</p>	<p><u>Iread-</u> Log onto classlink and complete 25 minutes of iredad.</p> <p>If you are unable to get online, you may read a book for 25 minutes instead. 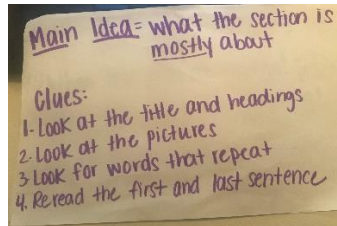

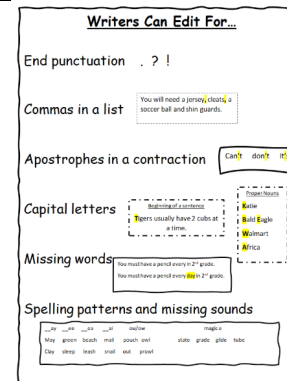
If you don't have access to the online material you can do the attached story and questions titled "Penguins".

Math

Unit 7 in Mathematics is a review unit. We will take this time to review the most common misconceptions with our 2nd grade standards. This week we will be focusing on telling time to the nearest five minute and counting coins.

<p>Today we will be reviewing telling time to the nearest five minutes.</p> <p>Watch the video linked. Click Here</p> <p>Then complete the activity attached called "Time to the five minute interval"</p> <p>If you cannot watch the video, practice skip counting by 5's to practice the minute hand of a clock. Then complete the activity attached like above.</p>	<p>Using the video attached, review what happens with the hour hand when the minute hand goes past the 30 minute. Click Here</p> <p>Remember the hour hand will start to move towards the next hour, but it is still the hour before.</p> <p>Practice drawing the hour hand and the minute hand using the attached sheet called "Telling time five minute intervals" where you have to draw the hands on the clock.</p> <p>If you do not have internet access, complete the sheet from above.</p>	<p>Use the attached activity from Khan Academy to practice money. Click Here</p> <p>If unable to access the Khan Academy activities, you can also watch this video to review coins. Click Here</p> <p>If you cannot access internet, see attached money chart called "Coins Poster"</p> <p>After watching videos or reviewing coins with the chart, complete the attached worksheet called "Money Quick Check"</p>	<p>See attached sheet called "Four Square Vocabulary", make a four-square vocabulary for the penny, nickel, dime, and quarter. How can you remember each coin? How do you describe the coins?</p> <p>After completing your four-square vocabulary, create three word problems using coins. For example: Mark has two nickels, four dimes, six pennies, and one quarter. How much does he have in all?</p> <p>After writing your three problems, solve them and check with your parent or sibling.</p>	<p>Remember the money song?</p> <p>"Penny, penny easily spent copper brown and worth one cent. Nickel, nickel thick and fat, you're worth five cents I know that! Dime, dime little and thin, I remember you're worth 10! Quarter, quarter big and bold, you're worth 25, I am told!"</p> <p>After singing the money song a few times, complete the attached assignment called "Problem solving with money my homework" page</p>
